Concert Band 1 (Freshman Band)

All Freshman band students are enrolled in Concert Band 1. All Marching Band freshman students **must** take this class. Students will perform in at least two concerts. Percussion students will sign-up for the Intermediate Percussion class only. Contributions: transportation, ASB cards, and instrument use.

Orchestra 1 (Freshman Orchestra)

All Freshman string musicians will be enrolled in Orchestra 1. Students perform at the Fall String Concert, Holiday Concert, Spring Concert, a Festival and at Baccalaureate. A one day trip is taken in the spring to perform in the Southern California area. Contributions: ASB card, concert attire, transportation, instrument use, and day trip expenses.



Color Guard

All freshmen who would like to try out to be a member of the Color Guard are required to attend workshops in May 2014. Auditions are held at the end of May. All Color Guard members participate in both the fall Marching Band season as well as the spring Winter Guard season. Color Guard meets your PE requirements.

Contributions: ASB card, transportation, uniforms, equipment use and trip expenses.

Marching Band

Performs at home football games, Saturday parades and field competitions and at local civic events. Marching Band is your PE class for the 1st semester. Wednesday night rehearsals during marching season are from 6:00-9:00 p.m. *New Marchers Camp will be held June 16-210, 2014 from 6:00— 9:00 p.m.*

Contributions: ASB card, transportation, and uniform reimbursement.



Girls Treble Choir and Boys Concert Choir

There are choral ensembles for all freshmen singers. Experience is not needed and auditions are *not* required. In addition to the four required performances each of the semesters, there are some optional performance opportunities.
